# **Background**

I am a theater artist focused on the creation of devised and original performance. This focus has its roots in my training at Cornish College of the Arts in Seattle where I majored in Original Works and was exposed to various techniques, training methods, and experiments such as the Suzuki Method of Actor Training, Viewpoints, Biomechanics, commedia dell' arte, and ensemble creation, among others. After graduation, I founded the critically acclaimed company Strike Anywhere Productions ("why God gave us small theater"- the Stranger), serving as Artistic Director. Under my direction the company fulfilled its mission of producing new and under-produced work for five years, including a year as the company in residence at the JEM Arts Center. In 2007, I moved to New York to immerse myself in all the influence the city has to offer in contemporary experimental theater and performance. In NYC I have presented my work in spaces such as The Kitchen, The Ohio Theatre, HERE Arts Center, Dixon Place, & the Bushwick Starr. In addition, I worked as a Teaching Artist in the New York Public Schools, was the Associate Producer at The Foundry Theatre for two seasons, and am an Associated Artist with Target Margin Theater. I am interested in participating in artistic conversations internationally which led me to assemble collaborators from Berlin, Copenhagen, and New York to create and produce work in Berlin under the name This Foreign Concept. I now live in Detroit with my partner and collaborator Jake Hooker where we've created a new company called A Host of People which mixes our love of hosting with our alternative art-practice to create work and situations than seek to invite audiences to be more at home with experimental art.
